LAKE ALICE-LAKE IRVINE AGREEMENT WITH BUREAU OF SPORT FISHERIES AND WILDLIFE

Secretary Hoisveen read that portion of the minutes of the February 14, 1964 meeting of the State Water Commission relative to the earthen plug in the

channel connecting Lakes Alice and Irvine in Ramsey County.

The elevation at which the temporary earthen plug and the proposed permanent structure would be maintained was discussed. It was explained that although the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife had a water right in Lake Alice to elevation 1443 feet MSL, granted by the State on May 25, 1938, it had flooding easements to only 1442 feet. Therefore, both the temporary and the permanent structures would be maintained at 1442 feet.

Commissioner Gray indicated that he thought the proposed agreement should be reviewed. Cliff Jochim read and explained in detail the agreement which he and Mr. Boos, the Bureau's Solicitor, had drafted and which had been tentatively approved by Secretary Hoisveen and Mr. Burwell, the Bureau's Regional Director.

Mr. Foughty asked whether or not the Chain Lakes Water Management District would be a party to the agreement. Mr. Jochim indicated that it was the intention of the Commission to enter into a separate agreement with the water management district and therefore it was not necessary that they be a party to the agreement with the Bureau.

Commissioner Gallagher indicated that he was opposed to the inclusion of the U. S. Weather Bureau in Section II of the proposed agreement. Section II reads as follows:

"That when the condition of the watershed is such and the U. S. Weather Bureau indicates that flooding is imminent the Bureau, upon notification by the State Engineer, shall cause the temporary earthen plug of the aforementioned channel to be removed in order to allow flood waters to pass from Lake Alice to Lake Tryine."

Mr. Jochim explained that it was felt that if the decision of determining when the waters of Lake Alice were at such a level and the weather conditions such that the plug must be removed was the sole responsibility of a single party to the agreement, the other party may not agree with the decision arrived at and thus cause the delay of removing the plug at a time when any delay could be disastrous. Also if such a decision would be a joint responsibility of both parties to the agreement again any difference in opinion could cause considerable damage. Thus, it was felt that if a third disinterested party were included, the decision of which both parties must abide by, the chances of any damage caused by a delay in acting would be greatly alleviated.

Mr. Boos indicated that the Bureau was not established as a flood control agency which refusal to act on behalf of the Commission would, in effect, make it if all reference to the U. S. Weather Bureau were deleted in view of the fact that Section VI placed responsibility for any damages on the Bureau if it acted on its own volition. Mr. Jochim replied that inasmuch as the Bureau had flooding easements to only 1442 feet, the level of the plug, it would, as a matter of self protection, remove the plug when the waters of Lake Alice threatened to exceed that level regardless of any resulting flood control benefits.

Commissioner Gallagher asked whether or not the proposed agreement specified the size of the permanent structure. Mr. Jochim answered that Section VIII specified that the permanent structure was to be "capable of discharging 1500 c.f.s. under 0.5 feet of head." Commissioner Gallagher wondered if 1500 c.f.s. would be adequate. Secretary Hoisveen indicated that 1500 c.f.s. would be sufficient as the structure is not intended to control all possible floods but is designed on the basis of a ten-year flood frequency. He implied that it was intended to pass water from Lake Alice to Irvine at a rate sufficient to abate flooding that possibly occurs three years out of ten when little or no water passes out of Lake Irvine, but flooding occurs on Lake Alice because there is no controlled spillway. Edmund L. Doeling, the Bureau's Hydrologist, gave a brief resume' of the Bureau's study relative to the size of the structure.

The Governor left the meeting at approximately 4:50 p.m. in order to fulfill a previous commitment. Commissioner Steinberger assumed the chairmanship in the Governor's absence.

Mr. Burwell suggested that any reference to the U.S. Weather Bureau be deleted from the agreement.

A general discussion relative to Sections II and VIII of the agreement, the elevations of the structure and Lake Alice, and the size of the permanent structure followed during which it was decided to:

- (1) Delete all reference to the U. S. Weather Bureau and
- (2) Delete all reference to the size of the permanent structure.

Mr. Jochim then read the agreement as revised and agreed upon. No further changes were suggested or made.

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that the agreement, as revised, be approved and Secretary Hoisveen be authorized to execute same, subject to the Governor's approval.

Acting Chairman Steinberger thanked Mssrs. Burwell, Boos and Doeling of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife for their cooperation in draftingan agreement acceptable to all parties and for their attendance at the meeting.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that, as previously indicated, the Chain Lakes Water Management District and the State Water Commission should enter into a separate agreement relative to the operation and maintenance of the channel and its plug.

Mr. Foughty indicated that the water management district would be willing to enter into any reasonable agreement, but that first it would want to know exactly what the Commission has in mind.

Commissioner Gallagher stated that the Commission would not necessarily want to impose any liability on the water management district, but would merely ask it to cooperate with the Commission and advise it of the lake's condition.

Mr. Jochim stated that it appears that the agreement would merely require the Chain Lakes Water Management District to cooperate with the Commission and to advise it of flooding conditions.

Mr. Foughty indicated that the Board of Commissioners of the water management district would be in a position to assist the State Water Commission by securing releases from the local landowners if it appears that their land will be flooded as a result of removing the plug or opening the permanent gated structure.

It was decided that Mr. Jochim would prepare an agreement and submit it to Mr. Foughty for consideration by the Board of Commissioners of the Chain Lakes Water Management District.

SURVEY RELATIVE TO WYARD DAM, FOSTER COUNTY

Secretary Hoisveen requested the authorization to make a survey relative to the raising of the

Wyard Dam, Foster County. He stated that Foster County had paid \$200 toward the survey cost. It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that approval be granted.

There being no further business, the

meeting adjourned at 5:20 p.m.
