MINUTES

NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Meeting Held in ParlorA, Gardner Hotel Fargo, North Dakota January 15, 1970

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. in Parlor A of the Gardner Hotel in Fargo, North Dakota, with Governor William L. Guy presiding.

PRESENT:

Governor William L. Guy, Chairman Richard P. Gallagher, Vice Chairman Arne Dahl, Commissioner, Department of Agriculture, Bismarck James Jungroth, Member from Jamestown Milo W. Hoisveen, State Engineer, Chief Engineer, and Secretary, State Water Commission, Bismarck

OTHERS PRESENT:

Alan Grindberg, Assistant Chief Engineer, State Water Commission, Bismarck Dick Crockett, Jr., North Dakota Water Resources Research Institute, NDSU, Fargo

MINUTES OF DECEMBER 12, 1969
MEETING APPROVED

Commissioner Gallagher moved and Commission Jungroth seconded that the minutes of the previous meeting be

approved as circulated. All members voted aye.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR DECEMBER, 1969 APPROVED

Secretary Hoisveen presented the financial statement for the first quarter of the biennium and for the

month of December, 1969. Secretary Hoisveen explained the status of the various accounts.

Commissioner Dahl moved the approval of the financial statement, Governor Guy seconded and all members voted aye.

REPORT OF THE STATE AUDITOR

Secretary Hoisveen presented the report
of the State Auditor, the most recent
audit of the accounts of the State Water

Commission. The letter from the State Auditor which explained that all was in order was read. The Chairman suggested that the minutes show that the report of the State Auditor was received and accepted.

WATER PERMIT FOR THE ANTI-BALLISTIC MISSILE SITE (#1400) Secretary Hoisveen reviewed the history of the water supplies for the safeguard missile. It was reported that the State Water Commission had done a ground-water

study which located the water supply for the missile. It was felt that the aquifer in the Fordville area more than met the requirements of the missile site as a water supply. Persons in that area, however, have expressed their concern that the use of this water by the Corps of Engineers for the missile might endanger

their water supply. Secretary Hoisveen reported that it is the feeling of the staff of the State Water Commission that the quantity which will be taken from that aquifer will not detract from the water supply in this area. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the State Water Commission is now in receipt of the application for a permit to appropriate water from the aquifer. This application has been filed by the Corps of Engineers. Secretary Hoisveen reported that this application contains language which states that the filing of this application does not waive any rights to this water which the Federal Government may have. Secretary Hoisveen reported that he had discussed this matter with the Corps of Engineers and that it was his feeling that this language would not be objectionable to the Commission. However, he wished to get the Commission's view on it.

The State Water Commission staff is going to hold an informational meeting in the Fordville area to attempt to allay the fears of the local citizens. The meeting will be held on January 21, 1970. The Corps of Engineers paid the State Water Commission \$2,500 towards the survey, this being the maximum amount they were authorized to pay without a contract. They also provided the State Water Commission with all the data compiled through the pump tests made in the fall of 1969.

Commissioner Gallagher moved that the State Water Commission accept the application as filed by the Corps of Engineers and proceed to advertise for the hearing on the water permit. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all members voted aye.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the Corps of Engineers be billed for the cost of the ground-water study which located this aquifer. The motion was seconded by Governor Guy. Two members voted aye; two members voted nay; the Chairman declared the motion lost for want of a majority.

REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUDIT AND FISCAL REVIEW COMMITTEE Secretary Hoisveen reported that the Legislative Audit and Fiscal Review Committee had deferred action on the Construction Bond Guarantee Fund until

after the State Water Commission held its next meeting. The Committee had been considering the elimination of this fund. Secretary Hoisveen reported that he felt that this could be a valuable tool for the State Water Commission if the authority is expanded so that it could be used in areas other than irrigation.

A disucssion of the Construction Bond Guarantee Fund ensued and a discussion of the possibility of expanding the authority followed. The Chairman stated that he believed that the Commission should go on record in favor of the Construction Bond Guarantee Fund, but not as defending this fund if a better, central fund is provided, which will guarantee all construction bonds for all State agencies. It was decided that further discussion on this matter should be held at the next meeting at which time it might be resolved.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF LAKE LEVELS Secretary Hoisveen presented a draft of proposed rules and regulations which will be used to establish the level at which a lake shall be controlled.

Governor Guy read the proposed rules and regulations to the Commission.

After considerable discussion, Commissioner Dahl moved to approve the proposed rules and regulations for establishment of control lake levels. Commissioner Jungroth seconded.

Commissioner Jungroth then moved to amend Rule No. I by adding the following sentence following the wording "Initiation of Action." The amendment reads "Action will be initiated by motion of the State Water Commission if it deems sufficient interest exists for determing a proper lake level," and the word "shall" following the wording "Action on the establishment of a controlled lake elevation under these rules" is to be deleted and insert in lieu thereof "may." Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

Commissioner Jungroth then moved that Rule No. 4 be amended by deleting all the wording following "the most desirable level" and inserting a period to follow that word. The language to be deleted is "considering the wishes of the local people in the economics of necessary control." Commissioner Dahl seconded; all members voted aye.

Commissioner Jungroth then moved to amend the proposed rules and regulations by amending Rule No. 8 and adding the wording "aesthetic values" as paragraph (a) and renumbering all existing paragraphs to comply with proper order. Commissioner Dahl seconded; all members voted aye.

Upon the motion to approve the rules and regulations as amended, all members voted aye. The Chairman declared the proposed rules and regulations approved.

PARK RIVER SNAGGING AND CLEARING (#662) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Mr. Glen Welter, County Commissioner of Walsh County. The letter requested Forest River as well as the Park River

assistance in snagging and clearing the Forest River as well as the Park River, which the Commission had approved by telephone earlier. It was reported that

the State Water Commission has made no commitments on the Forest River as regards maintenance of the channel.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission approve its earlier action in paying 50 percent of the snagging and clearing of the Park River from Homme Dam to the Red River but that it deny the request to participate in the Forest River snagging and clearing on the grounds that the State Water Commission has no responsibilities in that area. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all members voted aye.

Commissioner Gallagher then moved that the State Water Commission staff study the problems of snagging and clearing and attempt to develop a uniform policy which could be applied across the State. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all members voted aye.

WATER PERMITS NOS. 1655, 1660, and 1673 Secretary Hoisveen presented three water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that that these water permits be approved.

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Dahl, and carried that the three conditional permits be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit.

MORTON COUNTY RESOLUTION (#576) Secretary Hoisveen read a resolution from the Morton County Board of Commissioners pertaining to bank erosion problems on the Missouri River.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the Secretary prepare a forceful resolution asking the Corps of Engineers to conduct studies of this problem and also that the cause of the problem is the Garrison Dam and that correctional measures should be taken regardless of whether or not a favorable benefit-cost ratio is found to exist.

Commissioner Gallagher seconded; all members voted aye.

VELVA FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT (#347)

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter of appreciation from the Mayor of the city of Velva. The letter stated that the

city of Velva was very appreciative of the assistance that the State Water Commission had given it in flood fighting in the past. The letter from the

Mayor was especially commendatory in his remarks over the excellent work performed by the Assistant Chief Engineer, Alan Grindberg.

There being no further business, the State Water Commission adjourned to meet in joint session with the Garrison Conservancy District Board of Directors to hear a report by the Souris-Red-Rainy River Basins Commission Chairman, Mr. H. A. Hendrickson.

Appendix "A"

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For The Establishment of Controlled Lake Levels

Under the authority granted the State Water Commission by Sections 61-02-14(2b), 61-02-14(1g) and 61-02-28 of the North Dakota Century Code, and in order to firmly establish the elevation at which lakes in North Dakota should be maintained, these rules and regulations are created. Procedure in the operation of these rules and regulations shall be in conformance with Section 28-32 North Dakota Century Code, otherwise known as the Administrative Agencies Practices Act.

Rule No. 1: Initiation of Action.

Action will be initiated by motion of the State Water Commission if it deems sufficient interest exists for determining a proper lake level. Action on the establishment of a controlled lake elevation under these rules may also begin with the filing of a petition with the Secretary of the State Water Commission by the Water Management District Board of Commissioners who have jurisdiction over the area affected, or by the Board of County Commissioners if the lake in question is outside the boundaries of a water management district.

Rule No. 2: Contents of Petition.

The petition shall describe the lake in question and indicate the nature of the problem. It shall further indicate that the petitioning board is willing to participate in the construction, operation and maintenance of an outlet control structure if such construction is found to be desirable and feasible.

Rule No. 3: Hearing.

Upon receipt of petition the Secretary of the State Water Commission shall cause a hearing to be held in the area where the lake is located. The purpose of such hearing shall be to collect evidence from those concerned with the level of the lake. Notice of such hearing shall be given by mail and by publicity in the local news media to all persons and organizations which are known to be concerned. These shall include, but not be limited to: the water management district, the county commissioners, the township boards, cabin owner associations, adjacent farmers, resort owners, area wildlife clubs and interested state agencies.

Rule No. 4: Study.

After the hearing the Secretary of the State Water Commission shall cause a study to be made to develop a plan for controlling the lake elevation at the most desirable level.

Rule No. 5: Review.

The plan prepared shall be presented to all interested parties at a public meeting held in the county in which the lake is located. Advance publicity shall be given this review meeting in the same manner as that given the public hearing. Those specifically invited shall be the same types of groups and individuals.

Rule No. 6: Action by Local Governing Body.

After receipt of the plan of the State Water Commission the water management board having jurisdiction over the lake in question or in the absence of a water management board, the board of county commissioners having

such jurisdiction, shall have 30 days to take action recommending the Commission establish the lake level at a definite and stated elevation.

Rule No. 7: Biological Study.

The Secretary of the State Water Commission shall, immediately upon receipt of the petition under these rules, request the Commissioner of the State Game and Fish Department to have a survey conducted to determine a suggested lake level from the biological standpoint.

Rule No. 8: State Water Commission Action.

The plan prepared shall be presented to the State Water Commission as a proposal. Also included with the presentation to the Commission shall be comments of all interested parties. The State Water Commission shall make a determination as to the level at which the lake shall be finally maintained. In making such a determination, the State Water Commission shall consider as evidence: (a) aesthetic values; (b) the meandered elevation of the lake; (c) the report of the State Game and Fish Commissioner; (d) the effect of the established lake level on improvements in and around the lake; (e) the effect of the established control elevation on commercial and farming operations adjacent to the lake; (f) the effect of the controlled elevation on roads and other transportation facilties; (g) the hydrology of the lake and the feasibility of maintaining it at the controlled elevation; and, (h) the cost of installing necessary controls to insure that the controlled elevation is not exceeded.

Rule No. 9: Effect of the Establishment of a Controlled Elevation.

After the State Water Commission has issued its order establishing the elevation of a lake, all public bodies concerned with the lake shall respect this elevation as the proper elevation for this lake.

RESOLUTION 70-15-279

Appendix "C"

Missouri River Bank Stabilization

WHEREAS, as a part of the Missouri River Basin Development Project, large dams and reservoirs have been constructed by the Federal Government, which inundate all of the Missouri River bottomland except that 70-mile reach between Garrison Dam and the headwaters of the Qahe Reservoir in North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the operation of these dams is causing extremely severe erosion to the banks of this 70-mile reach causing hardship to the State and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, attempts at corrective measures to date have only resulted in several small projects which are grossly inadequate in view of the magnitude of the problem; and

WHEREAS, the problem is part and parcel of the entire Missouri River Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission at its regular meeting in Fargo, North Dakota, this 15th day of January, 1970 that it does respectfully urge the Congress to provide funds to the Corps of Engineers to study this problem and plan and install adequate protective works; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Congress and the Corps of Engineers be informed that the State Water Commission feel that corrective measures in this case should not have to stand on a benefit-cost ratio by itself, but the cost thereof should be borne by the entire Missouri River Basin Projects; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be forwarded to Lt. General Frederick J. Clarke; Colonel O. H. Robinson; Colonel B. P. Pendergrass; Senators Milton R. Young and Quentin N. Burdick; and Representatives Mark Andrews and Thomas Kleppe.
